

St. Augustine Founders Day Celebration and Mass with the Bishop

On Saturday, September 7th, the Assembly Color Corp participated in the re-enactment of Pedro Menéndez's 1565 landing on the shores of St. Augustine. The events took place at the Shrine of Our Lady of La Leche at Mission Nombre De Dios. After the re-enactment, an outdoor Mass was held. The events commemorate the establishment of America's first parish in 1565.

HISTORY: On July 28, 1565 Pedro Menendez set sail from Spain to conquer Florida. Led by his flagship the San Pelayo, the leading ships reached Puerto Rico on August 8th. He left Puerto Rico on August 15th with five ships and reached Cape Canaveral on August 25th. On the feast day of St. Augustine, August 28th, he sailed into a nearby inlet. On September 8, 1565, he officially named the area St. Augustine. This became the first permanent settlement in the United States. He then claimed all of Florida for Spain.

We Stand on Ethical Ground

"There are many companies in the pharmaceutical and communications industries that would undoubtedly provide excellent returns for us, but which are not in our portfolio because they engage in research and development or programming in ways that violate the sanctity or dignity of human life."


