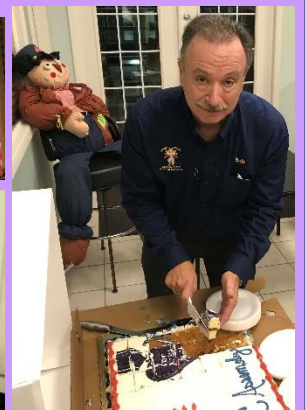

St. Mary's Parish Celebrates Poland Independence Day Mass



St. Mary's Church in Bunnell celebrated a Poland Independence Day Mass on Sunday, November 11th. The Corpus Christi Assembly Color Corp was present and served as Honor Guard for the Mass.

"National Independence Day is a national day in Poland celebrated on November 11th to commemorate the anniversary of the restoration of Poland's sovereignty as the Second Polish Republic in 1918 from the German, Austrian and Russian Empires. Following the partitions in the late 18th century, Poland ceased to exist for 123 years until the end of World War I, when the destruction of the neighboring powers allowed the country to reemerge. It is a non-working day in Poland.

The restoration of Poland's independence was gradual. The date of November 11th is the one on which Marshal Józef Piłsudski assumed control of Poland. The holiday was constituted in 1937 and was celebrated only twice before World War II. After the war, the communist authorities of the People's

Republic removed Independence Day from the calendar, though reclamation of independence continued to be celebrated informally on November 11th. The holiday was officially replaced by the National Day of Poland's Revival as Poland's National Day, celebrated on the July 22nd anniversary of the communist PKWN Manifesto under Joseph Stalin. In particular, during the 1980s, in many cities, including Warsaw, informal marches and celebrations were held, with the outlawed Solidarity Movement supporters participating. Typically these marches were brutally dispersed by the communist militarized police forces, with many participants arrested and often tortured by the security police. During this time the November 11th Independence Day marches, alongside the Constitution Day on the May 3rd celebration gatherings, also banned by the communist authorities, were the customary dates of demonstrations by the opponents of the communist regime.

As Poland emerged from communism in 1989, the original holiday—on its original November 11th date—was restored."

Assembly 2810 Gives Tribute to Our Veterans with Honor Guard

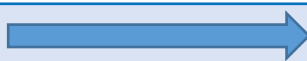
Corpus Christi Assembly 2810 answered the call-out to stand Honor Guard during the annual Flagler County Veteran's Day Ceremony. The event took place on Monday, November 12th at the Flagler County Government Services Building.

A keynote address was delivered by retired U.S. Army Col. Hal Kushner, an ophthalmologist in Daytona Beach. He stated that he carries a card in his pocket that is a Medal of Honor citation for Bill Port, who threw himself on a grenade in Vietnam in 1968, saving the lives of three other soldiers. Port later succumbed to his injuries, dying in Kushner's arms. Kushner went on ask that his fellow Americans step forward and serve our country.

Marine Veteran Joe Kowalsky was presented with the Flagler County's Veteran of the Year award. Kowalsky is a Marine veteran that has volunteered for almost four decades in Flagler County. He represents the Marine Corps League on the Flagler County Veterans Advisory Council and is also active in Disabled American Veterans Chapter 86 and Access Flagler.

THE OLDER I GET, I must confess, the more I read obituaries. ... Most obituaries, as you know, provide minimal information about the deceased. But some highlight a major accomplishment.



... What about the saints whose relics we venerate this morning — what could be said of their lives? How does their so-called “obituary” read?

St. Jean Vianney, we would say, had a priestly heart and revived a dying parish by the sheer force of his holiness and integrity.

The Mexican Martyrs, priests and members of the Knights of Columbus, defied anti-clerical laws that forbade their ministry and paid the ultimate price.


St. Edith Stein discovered deeply the truth of Christ, became a Carmelite nun, and gave her life for the Truth in the concentration camp at Auschwitz.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was led to the fullness of faith, had a passion for educating the young, and founded the Daughters of Charity in nearby Emmitsburg, Md. ...


What about us? What would you like to see in the first line of our obituaries? ... I’m proposing a reality check on the overall trajectory of our life. ... For someday, we’ll stand before the Lord, in the particular judgment at the end of our lives and in the final judgment described for us today in the Gospel of St. Matthew. ...

What rolls off our tongue every time we pray for Father McGivney’s canonization? ... “Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love, so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast.” As members of the Knights of Columbus, as Knights of Charity, this is what we should be known for! This should be what’s written on our souls when we stand before the merciful Judge.

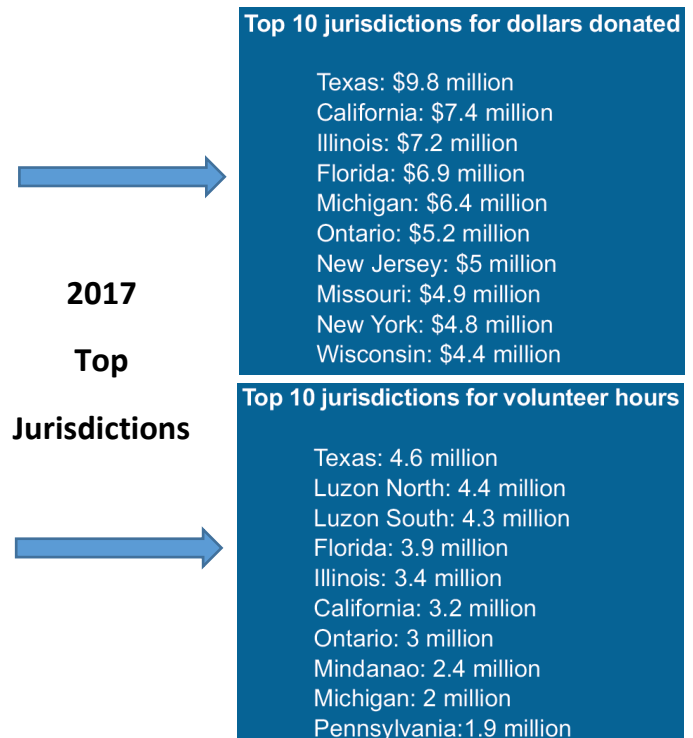
The Patriotic Degree
